Last year we expanded the Fall Officers Meeting into more of a conference and we are taking that concept and adding to it so this year the event is primarily a *SKI PATROLLERS CONFERENCE*. We will still be conducting the Fall Officers Meeting for those of you who want or might need to be heard on an issue but we are making the weekend a fun weekend dedicated to the patrollers of the division.

This year our new Executive Director of the National Ski Patrol, **Tim White**, will attend our conference. You will be able to hear what has, is and will be going on with the National Ski Patrol from the best source of information available. Every patroller at the conference will also have an opportunity to talk with our Executive Director about where we will be heading with the National Ski Patrol. A lot is going on with patrolling and this Southern Division Conference will be history in the making.

history, conduct a CPR Class for patrollers, hold the Instructor Update Course for the Outdoor Emergency Care Instructors and provide an Instructor Development Course for patrollers who would like to begin instructing in any discipline. Awards will be given out during the evening Banquet on Saturday with special invitations going to those patrollers who will receive service awards for years dedicated to the NSP this year. We also are asking ski shops to attend and bring pro forms and equipment for our patrollers.

The Kingsport Area is a fabulous venue for the family. Dollywood is not far away and there will be local attractions information for you and for the family. Shopping in this area is always great and the resort is a destination resort for golfers. Plan to spend an extra day and enjoy all of the benefits of our discounted room rates. Every night there will be a party in the hospitality suite for patrollers, their families and their guests.

A new, Leadership Course is being developed for the National Ski Patrol by members of the Southern Division. FACT versus RUMOR

Question: We have policies and procedures clearly published regarding our own patrol's involvement in medical treatment of a patient and what can and can't be discussed by patrollers but what are the rules regarding information discussed with us about an event involving a foreign patrol?

This issue recently was sent to the Executive Committee of the Southern Division for review. The facts might differ but it can occur that a patroller knows someone (usually a non-patroller) who has had a family member or a friend injured in a snow sports accident at another resort.

The family member or friend discusses the matter with the patroller and the discussion turns critical and may indicate a desire to sue. During this discussion the patroller is told certain facts about the event. Some or all of these facts may be accurate, some may be partly accurate or some or all may be a total misconception of what actually took place. What does a patroller do with this information?

The Executive Committee discussed various answers to try to find the best solution. Some of the discussion included the following answers. Remain silent? Report it to his or her Patrol Representative? Report it to his or her Patrol Director? Report it to the first patroller he or she runs into from that patrol? Report it up the chain of command of NSP? If the patroller does contact someone, should one use the telephone, U. S. Postal Service or email?

The Executive Committee discussed this at length and determined a guide for the Southern Division on how to handle this difficult problem. Here were our thoughts about how best to answer these issues.

First, everyone agreed one should not remain silent if criticism was voiced about how a matter was handled. The patrol involved would want to know so they might address a problem or if there was no problem with treatment of the patient, they might want to decide what if anything to do about a false rumor. This might especially be true if there were newspaper accounts published and the facts were stated incorrectly in the newspaper. This also might be the first indication of someone considering the filing of a suit and here knowledge is valuable for the protection of evidence for everyone concerned. Anytime litigation is mentioned public comment should be limited so as not to find "off the cuff" statements being used as a basis for a subpoena for a court appearance.

Second, it was agreed that email should not be used. It is not secure enough to handle this type of communication.

Third, the Executive Committee agreed that since this issue is an operational issue dealing with resort operations and the potential for resort liability, the patroller should report this matter to the Patrol Director of his or her patrol. The Patrol Director should be requested to contact the Patrol Director of the patrol being discussed and involved in the original event by mail or telephone but never by email. This keeps the matter within the chain of command on the operational side of the NSP house and would not involve the NSP directly unless and until a suit was actually filed. The report should include the information, which was related to the patroller, along with the name and contact information of the patroller who heard the information. The matter should not be discussed with any other person (patroller or otherwise) so as not to compound the problem.

Fourth, if a line officer or program officer is told of the matter then the line officer or program officer should ask the patroller to follow the guidelines in the above steps. A follow-up phone call to the patroller and his Patrol Director would be in order to confirm how it was handled. Whenever a legal question arises every one should always direct this inquiry to the Region or Division Legal Advisor.

It will be a rare instance when one patroller is told of information about an accident at another patrol but it has and will happen in the future. Rather than be without guidance on this rare issue, the Executive Committee thought it wise to provide some guidance.

Thanks to those of you who have taken the few minutes to fill out this rather simple two-page report and email it to me. For those of you who have suffered an injury while patrolling or training for patrol, please consider visiting our website

(www.southernnsp.org) clicking on the FIPS Injury Report Survey button (found on the right side of the homepage at the bottom of the box titled "Southern News"), filling it out and emailing it to me. Remember, this is for either current injuries, past injuries or will be used for injuries that may befall any of us in the future. This survey will help to identify, qualify, and quantify the nature and severity of injuries that may be incurred while patrolling, so that in the future we might identify certain procedures and practices that may need to be altered so that some injuries may be prevented.

Have a good off-season, and we look forward to seeing many of you at the Patrollers Conference this Fall in Kingsport, Tennessee.

The Southern Division has a new Legal Committee. It's members are active Southern Division patrollers admitted to practice law in several of the jurisdictions within the Division. The Committee has already undertaken a number of tasks for the Division and its patrollers. It modified a new NSP risk management form for use by instructors and program administrators at ski patrol courses or events. It has worked with Division Director Morgan Armstrong in drafting a proposal for a national patroller immunity bill to be adopted by Congress. It has also addressed other important issues facing local patrols, such as the effect that patrol purchase of equipment such as snowmobiles may have upon federal and state tax-exempt status.

Hello everyone. The Southern Division Snowsports School continues to be alive and well. In the 2006-07 ski season we attempted to contact everyone that was listed on our roster as being affiliated with our ski school. Basically we needed updated addresses, contact information, current PSIA/AASI level and continuing education obtained in such. Additionally, there was a brief survey soliciting your opinion of needs and wants from the program. Thanks very much to everyone that took the time to answer my request. I received information from every patrol within the Southern Division with the exception of those in the West Virginia Region.

The survey results were really no surprise in that our members stated that they wanted and needed more localized training opportunities as well as better communication between the Snowsports School and its members. Due to a variety of influences this past ski season I was unable to visit many of the Patrols as previously planned but due to the hard work on the part of all Instructors, Instructors of Record and Instructor Trainers we had a very successful season.

PROGRAM STATISTICS 2007-2008 SEASON:

- 61 Instructor Candidates currently in the Mentoring Process
- 30 NEW Instructors completed Mentoring Program
- 342 Total OEC Instructors currently on Southern Division Roster
- 12 Cycle "C" Refreshers held
- 6 Cycle "C" Make-Up Refreshers held
- 24 OEC Courses were run 3 of which are currently underway or about to start

Instructor Status must be renewed every 3 years - within each 3-year period (check your card for your renewal date) an Instructor must:
