The Annual Meeting and Patroller Conference will include presentations from the National Ski Patrol Chairman of the NSP Board of Directors and the National Ski Patrol Legal Advisor. In addition to the Annual Meeting of the Southern Division Board of Directors, the meeting will have an Outdoor Emergency Care Instructor Update Course, a segment of the new pilot program called the National Ski Patrol Leadership Course and at least one CPR Course. Additional events and courses will be announced in the reservation information that will be sent at a later time.

Members of the Board of Directors of the Southern Division need to attend Saturday from 8:00 AM until 5:00 PM, the Awards Banquet Saturday night and the session on Sunday from 8:00 AM until 12:00 Noon in order for the business of the Southern Division to be properly concluded with the necessary quorum present. Various matters of importance will be presented at this meeting including necessary ratification of certain officer positions and actions taken by the Executive Committee during the year.

The Annual Meeting of the Board of Directors is open to all patrollers of the Southern Division and a larger and improved hospitality suite will be open Friday and Saturday night for registrants. Everyone is invited to attend the Awards Banquet on Saturday night and participate in the celebration of the awards being presented to deserving patrollers, officers, instructors and patrols.
